Section B - Fire Response Vehicle Identifier Release Form	<p>I acknowledge that the following applies to me:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) <i>the Fire Response Vehicle Identifier received by me is for the purpose of fire response by the vehicle listed above;</i> 2) <i>when this vehicle is no longer used as a fire response vehicle (e.g. when sold) the identifier will be removed;</i> 3) <i>it is the responsibility of the owner and driver of the vehicle to comply with the Road Traffic Act 1974;</i> 4) <i>this identifier could be revoked by an Incident Controller or authorised person at any time;</i> 5) <i>appropriate Personal Protective Equipment and Clothing will be worn at all times;</i> 6) <i>the driver will ensure that the vehicle's presence at an incident is recorded on both arrival and departure;</i> 7) <i>all operators will have completed Rural Fire Awareness* or higher prior to operating the vehicle;</i> 8) <i>the vehicle is fitted with a working UHF radio;</i> 9) <i>the vehicle is appropriately fitted with a quality working flashing beacon (amber);</i> 10) <i>the vehicle is in a roadworthy and safe operational condition;</i> 11) <i>the fire equipment is kept in a good, working condition;</i> 12) <i>I have received a copy of the "Guidelines for Operating Private Equipment at Bushfires" and will make drivers of the vehicle familiar with this document to follow all condition within.</i>
